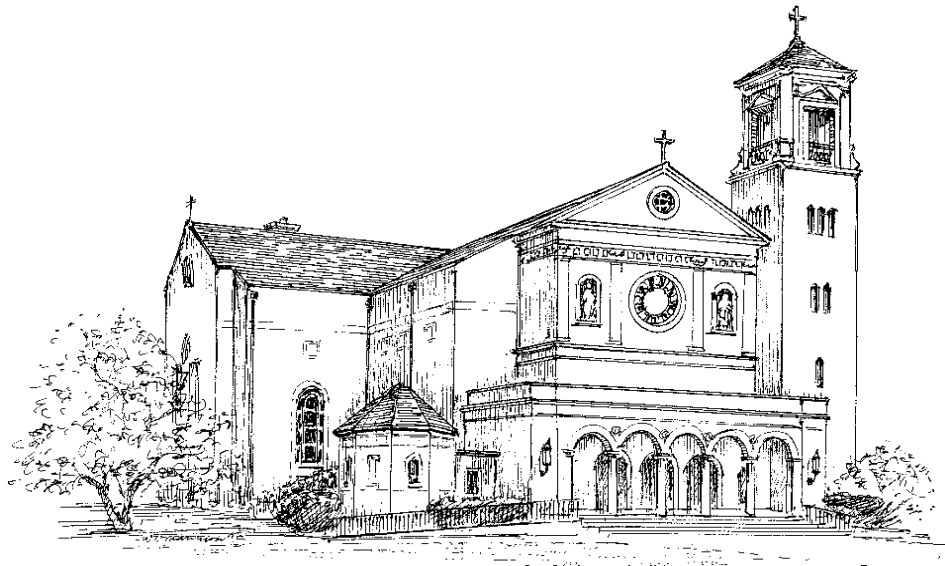

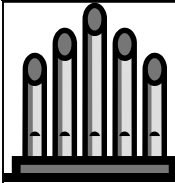

### **YOU MAY HAVE A CLAIM AGAINST THE CATHOLIC DIOCESE OF WILMINGTON, INC.**

On October 18, 2009, the Catholic Diocese of Wilmington, Inc. (the "Debtor") filed for protection under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code") in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Delaware (the "Bankruptcy Court").

**THE LAST DAY TO FILE AN ABUSE CLAIM AGAINST THE DEBTOR IS**  
**APRIL 15, 2010 AT 4:00 P.M. (PREVAILING EASTERN TIME).**

**IF YOU WERE ABUSED BY ANY MEMBER OF THE CLERGY OR ANY OTHER PERSON CONNECTED WITH THE CATHOLIC DIOCESE OF WILMINGTON, INC. YOU MUST FILE A CLAIM BY APRIL 15, 2010 AT 4:00 P.M. (PREVAILING EASTERN TIME).**
